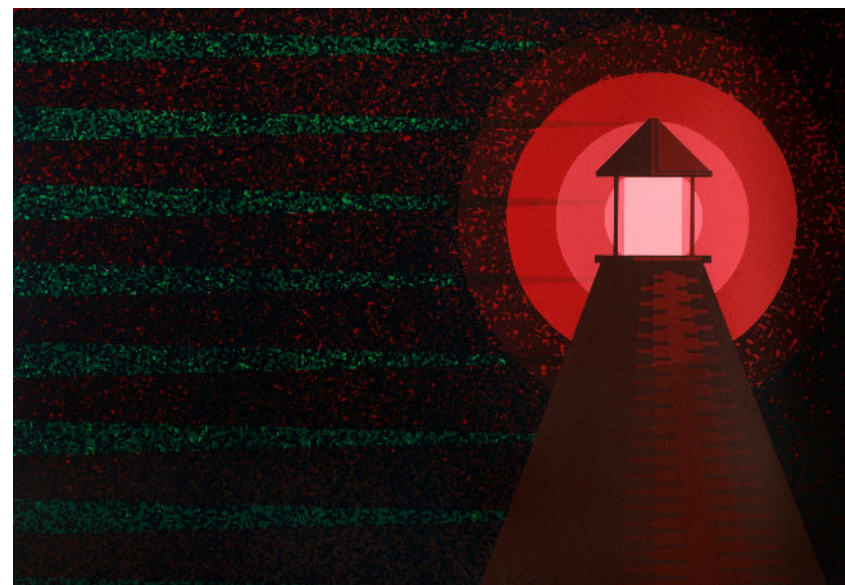
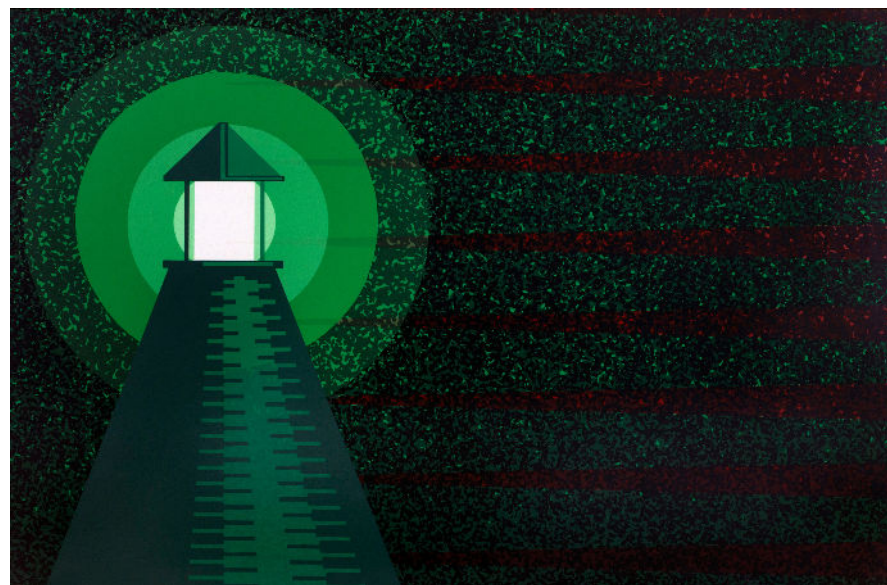


'Ship to Shore' Online Learning Programme

Workshops Available

Katie's Island Adventures (P2-P4)

Using the popular Katie Morag books as inspiration, pupils will learn about life on Scottish islands and the vital link puffer ships like MV Spartan provided to the mainland. We'll investigate maps, sea charts, compass points and balance and find out how to explore MV Spartan from the classroom.

Ship Shape Science (P2-P4)

What do we have to think about when designing a ship? Learn about Lifejackets (Safety at Sea), Floating and Sinking, Balance and Friction.

FAQs

What is included with each workshop booking?

Each workshop comprises of two live links with our Learning and Access team and a digital resource pack containing activities, challenges and Teacher Notes. As well as STEM based activities there are links to our national art collection and outdoor learning opportunities.

The first live link with our Learning and Access team provides a 20 minute starter session and an introduction to the resources provided and challenges set. The second live link is a follow up session (we recommend allowing one week between sessions) giving pupils the opportunity of sharing their discoveries and creations. It also features an 'unboxing' of some of our museum collection relevant to topic of session booked.

Which Online Learning platforms do you use?

We are able to deliver the live workshop sessions using MS Teams, Zoom or Google Meet , in accordance with local education authority guidelines. If you would prefer to use another platform please contact our Learning and Access team to discuss.

Who will deliver the live sessions ?

After a preliminary call in the days before your booked first live session, our experienced and knowledgeable Learning and Access team will deliver both live sessions.

Can this workshop only be delivered in class?

If a 'blended learning' model is adopted in your school our live sessions can be delivered when the pupils are at home, if they are able to connect to the online platform you have chosen. Class teachers will be supplied with a 'Joining in at home' document that can be distributed to pupils and parents with tips on how to join, guidance on online etiquette and what to expect in the session.
